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Please comment on the strong points of this instructor's teaching and presentation: -

- I have genuinely never had another professor that cares about teaching as much as Prof. Ortiz. He was always available and never once seemed annoyed with the amount of questions I asked (and there were a lot). He was incredibly enthusiastic and was miraculously able to fit a semester's worth of content into a 6week online course. The material was incredibly challenging, but I think his availability and willingness to answer all questions helped make it more straightforward. Many professors claim to be open to questions, but I have honestly never had an instructor who demonstrated the level of communication ability that Prof. Ortiz did this summer.

- The teaching style was great, this course however is very difficult to learn in the condensed nature it was presented in. Professor Ortiz however always was very good with answering questions and trying to make the learning environment comfortable.
- Presentations were always on point and easy to understand with the professor's explanation. It was no trouble trying to find the required material for the course.
- He makes a hard class seem easy. Lectures make clear what we have to know for exams
- The classes were interesting and the professor was always available to answer questions. However, the exams were too difficult and long. Additionally, having a final paper and a final exam was a bit too much to handle. Problem sets were also graded harshly.
- Really good and prepared classes. Outline matched the class and I could follow the lectures.
- He is a nice person, always being patient during lectures.
- He responds promptly to emails and is very accessible and helpful. He explains concepts thoroughly. He sets aside class time for us to complete our assignments and exams and final project.
- Very clear explanation of the materials. Also really helpful feedbacks for the final essay

Please comment on aspects of this instructor's teaching and presentation that might be improved: -

- He is a great teacher but I think he was very inconsiderate in this course in terms of expecting too much. Summer being online and remote made it difficult to actually complete a final project. I felt overwhelmed and pressured. Most other classes that (to my knowledge) should involve final projects at the end of the semester do not require students to do so over the summer because of how packed everything is. Julio still expected a research paper in addition to all of the problem sets and exams we had. I couldn't collaborate efficiently and effectively with my team because none of us are in the same country and timezone. A lot of miscommunication took place. Julio expected too much, though he was supportive and nice. I think he should've been more considerate especially to international students because of the time difference and also the challenges experienced by students who live in areas with high covid rates who might have been personally affected by the pandemic in any way. Too much was expected to be done in such a short time, things were really overwhelming. He also uses questions that involve voting a lot. I know this is a statistics class, but he should've limited this because I am not American so I have no understanding of Democratic and Republican parties. I keep getting confused because it is not to my common knowledge.
- The questions might be a little bit hard for a 200-level course. And the lectures materials are really a lot.
